There continues to be inadequate consideration of the impact on the upper tideway, when water accelerated through Teddington meets flood water in the upper tideway, exacerbated by spring tides. With the expected reduced use of the tidal barrier (see TE2100) their combined effect could be very damaging. Convince us the River Thames scheme is not just exporting its problems to lower reaches of the river.
